Location:

Where is the Blue Bell Campus Location?

We are located at 1802 Skippack Pike, ¾ of a mile west of the intersection of Routes 202 and 73.

What type of space is it?

We are currently renting space from St. John Lutheran Church. It is a lovely facility with bright open classrooms, a lot of open space, and a warm multi purpose room where we have Shabbat services and family programs.

Is KI looking for their own building?

We have been housed at St. John's since our Blue Bell campus opened. We do hope to establish our own building with a preschool.

Programming

What will KI offer in Blue Bell?

We offer monthly Shabbat services and dinners, family programming, religious school, adult education, social justice opportunities, and holiday celebrations.

If I live in the northern suburbs can I come to things in Elkins Park?

Absolutely! The Elkins Park and Blue Bell locations serve all our members.

What is there for families with children in Blue Bell?

Many of our programs will be geared toward families with young children. Our services include the KI puppets and informal guitar led services with potluck dinners. Holiday programs focus on activities for families with kids.

What will there be for older adults in Blue Bell?

We recognize that there are many adult communities in the Blue Bell area. Our rabbis are available for regular adult education classes and lectures during the week. We will also be looking to develop programming for older adults as we become more established and understand what people are interested in.

When is the first service in Blue Bell?

Our first Shabbat is Friday night August 27th. We will be having a potluck dinner and service beginning at 6:00 PM.
